

AquaX Water: Best Since Sliced Bread?



Hi-Energy, Structure Enhanced 100% Natural Artesian Water Just Might Be...

Anaheim, California, March 10, 2007 – Your Soy Daily reporter already knew about AquaX Water. He (heck, the whole staff knew) knew about how good it tasted and how it made him feel.

“Nora and I began working on an approach that utilized a naturalist approach of looking at the environment as a model. We wanted to see if we could replicate the forces behind water in its most pristine form,” Wheeler said.

“It took two years to develop a prototype. It was time consuming, going through several formats until we found the right combination,” Kosztolanyi added.

“We began using an artesian water from the Cascade mountain range in Oregon, which is a wonderful potable. But we also found that any source water will work when the technology is applied – it’s all about restoring water back to its natural state,” Wheeler offered.

He was quick to point out, however, that given a choice, it is better to begin with a water that’s already high in quality. That’s when they found Rim Rock water, that emanates from an underground spring near Sedona, Arizona and is piped underground to the plant nearby.

“The Rim Rock water has life in it”, Wheeler pointed out. “It has many properties and dimensions, which is what makes it so compatible. In our application, we have combined every aspect of the geometry, motion and pH factor of the water, which has the ability to become infused in the water, allowing it to interact with your cells in an infinite way. Testing at the Rim Rock plant, we found the molecular cluster size was reduced when our process was added.”

“Normally your body and the water you drink will not match in pH levels,” Kosztolanyi said. “This is part of the process: You want the body to be able to receive the right level of cellular impact. With this application, facilitation is immediate, and it will detoxify and/or hydrate the body at the cellular level.”

The key issue, they said, in the technology is in the natural restoration of water. “If someone can prove us wrong, have him come forward,” Wheeler said. “I Have never seen another approach of enhancing water that really duplicates nature in terms of creating a high-energy oxygen-available micro-structured water.

It occurs in the environment under ideal conditions; we have discovered a way to replicate it.”

Although your Soy Daily reporter is already a believer, I asked them how best to provide information to others so they realize AquaX water is not ‘snake oil?’

In his answer, Wheeler began by saying that the issue of belief in our society is complicated, and there are many opinions about what constitutes health care and what's healthy.

"The bottom line? Just drink it and see how you feel," he said. "There is absolutely nothing foreign applied to AquaX, nothing. No minerals, substances, no heavy duty electromagnetic forces, no ionization.

You can begin as a skeptic, but once you try, feel and then believe it, you can talk about the science.

There is a very reasonable science behind this water", Wheeler pointed out, "that's supported by mainstream principles."

Kosztolanyi added: "You have to try the product, but one should also look at the studies – the objective studies. You can like or not like, but you can't fault the studies , which were done primarily at Livermore Laboratories here in California. The in-vitro work was done in a private laboratory in Nevada."

In case you're wondering, there are no side effects – after two years of study, seven more of application and further testing. There can't be, because nothing is added to the water. The molecular structure is altered, but nothing is being added.

"Would any product be enhanced by adding AquaX to it?", I asked.

Wheeler answered: "Yes, because when you have a substance dissolved in solution, water structure and energy goes into the nutrients. Using AquaX as base will improve and energize the solution to which it's added."

He continued: "It's the internal structure dynamics that makes it more enlivened and therefore, more pleasing to the taste buds.

That's why I think the experience of the water centers on all individuals who try it," Wheeler added. "Once this is known, then people can better get their hands around the science.

Most in our society like to know there's science behind any product that's available for consumption. In the past few years, we've had positive reports from people all over the world of the good this water is doing them."

As we talked, I realized there was much more to AquaX than just a wonderful drinking water that makes you feel great: "It has multiple applications – as a drinking water, a base for other products, in animal and human health care, other medical applications, agriculture, horticulture and even to enhance fossil and alternative fuels," Wheeler said.

"Nora and I are working now on a technology that overlaps with natural hydration techniques that will energize fuel, making it burn more efficiently in the presence of oxygen."

As this fascinating interview came to a close, Nora Kosztolanyi made a statement that indicated to your Soy Daily reporter how dedicated these people are to what they've developed.

She said – "You know, lots of companies get into the water business strictly for profit. Our primary interest is in developing something that will truly help people, have multiple applications and help change the world for the better."

An important adjunct to their work is a foundation they plan to create, where much of the profits from their discovery will go, and be used to find even more ways to better the lives of others.

The best advice we can give at this point? Go out and buy a few bottles of AquaX (look for the new label, which is illustrated in this article) – drink up, and see how you feel. Regional distribution is about to begin.
